Welcome to the 2013 Audemars Piguet QEII Cup to be held on Sunday 28th April.

The Audemars Piguet QEII Cup promises to be a stellar occasion with 14 exciting runners, including six international G1 scorers, competing in the prestigious 2000 metre contest. Ambitious Dragon, Hong Kong's reigning Horse of the Year will face this year's Hong Kong Derby victor Akeed Mofeed, and old foe and two-time G1 Hong Kong Cup hero California Memory, as well as Dubai Duty Free winner Sajjhaa, which leads the four top drawer overseas contenders hailing from Japan, South Africa and the United Arab Emirates.

In the **FORM GUIDE**, the **PERFORMANCE ANALYSIS** table provides you with a bird-eye's view of the race. This at-a-glance guide gives you a full form summary of the horses in a simple and concise table.

Another handy tool is the **INTERNATIONAL RATINGS CHART**. In weight-for-age races like the Audemars Piguet QEII Cup, generally speaking, the higher a horse's rating, which is based on racing performance, the better its chance to win.

A preliminary **SPEED CHART** has been included to assist in identifying likely positions in running. Please note that this is preliminary only and the full Speed Map will be available after barrier draw in the SpeedPOWER Form Guide on www.hkjc.com/english/formguide/formguide.asp.

If you need further information and analysis, just flip over to the next section where you will find the **COMPREHENSIVE PAST PERFORMANCE** of the horses. Also included is the **FORM ANALYSIS**, which highlights the notable achievements and racing characteristics of each horse. Another feature is the **RATINGS HISTORY CHART**. This chart indicates the quality and consistency of a horse's previous 10 starts through a graphical illustration of the ratings achieved in these races.

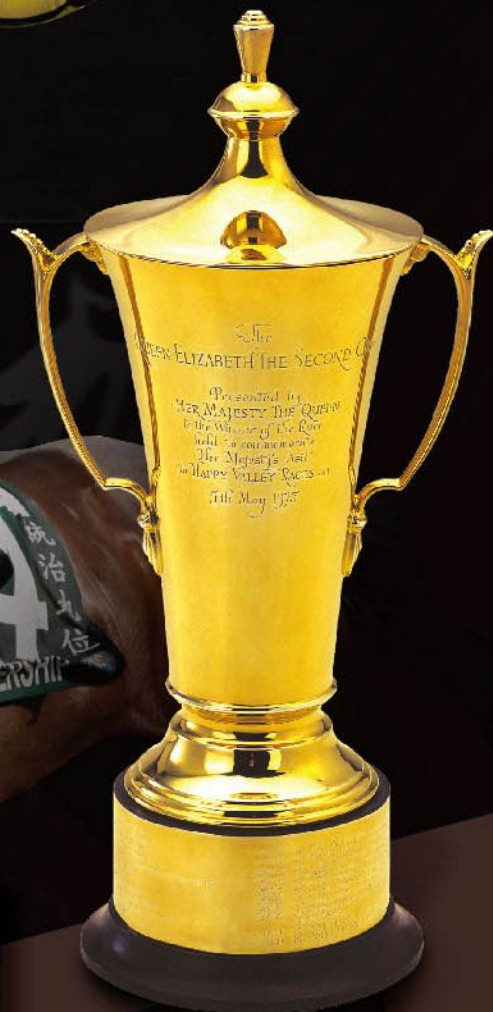

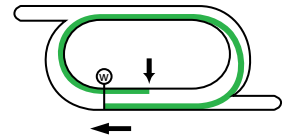

Audemars Piguet QEII Cup (Group 1)

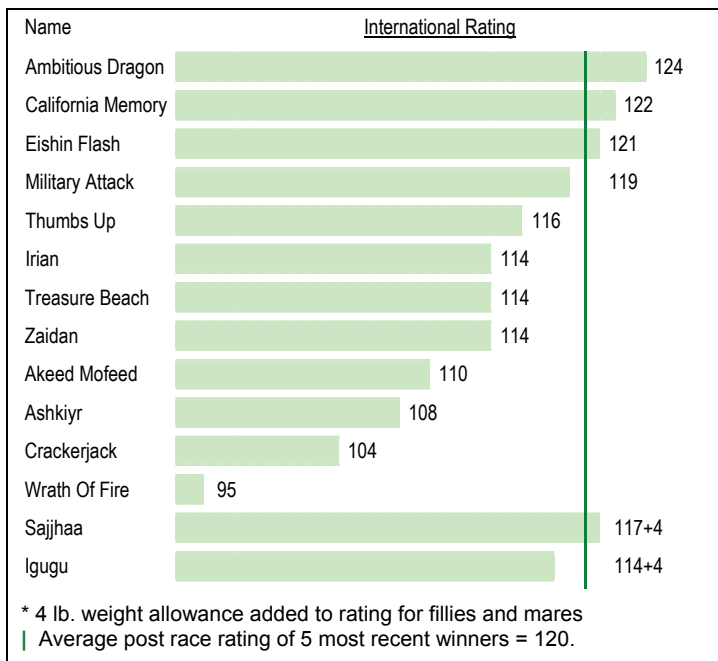

bin Suroor, Saeed
Sajjhaa

Aged 44, Saeed bin Suroor took out his trainer's licence in 1994 and a year later joined Sheikh Mohammed's mighty Godolphin operation with his main bases in England (April to November) and Dubai. He has been champion trainer in Britain four times and has notched over 170 G1 wins worldwide. Dubai Millennium is widely considered the best horse he has trained. His major Hong Kong wins have come in the QEII Cup (1996 Overbury), the HK Cup (2000 Fantastic Light, 2007 Ramonti), the HK Mile (2004 Firebreak) and the HK Vase (2010 Mastery). Other stars he has trained include Daylami, Lammtarra, Shamardal, Sakhee, Street Cry, Kazzia, Halling and Marienbard. He has already hit the G1 mark this year thanks to Sajjhaa's Dubai Duty Free success in March.


Cruz, Derek
Crackerjack, Wrath Of Fire

Aged 57, Derek Cruz was licensed as a trainer in 1991. He enjoyed a first G1 victory in December 2005 when Natural Blitz shocked most observers by snatching the Hong Kong Sprint. Then 2009/10 was something of a breakthrough season as he prepared Good Ba Ba to win a record third successive G1 HK Mile and won the inaugural running of the G3 Al Quoz Sprint at the Dubai World Cup meeting with Joy And Fun. Last season he sent out Joy And Fun to win the HKG1 Chairman's Sprint Prize and run third in the Al Quoz Sprint (now a G1) and this year he peaked the stable stalwart for a fine second in the Al Quoz Sprint. He has already collected a big prize this term after Cerise Cherry took the HKG2 Premier Bowl for a second time. He has an overall Hong Kong career tally of 478 wins with 16 this season (as of 15 April).


Cruz, Tony
California Memory, Zaidan

Aged 56, six times Hong Kong's champion jockey, Cruz rode 946 winners. He first landed the HK trainer's title in 1999/2000 and regained it in 2005, when he set a new record for a season's winners (91) and earnings (HK\$113m). His most famous horses have been Silent Witness, the dual HK Sprint and nine-time G1 winner; Bullish Luck, five-time G1 winner and winner of the G1 Yasuda Kinen in Japan; and dual G1 HK Cup (2011 & 2012) hero California Memory. Lucky Owners' double in the HK Mile and HK Derby and Helene Mascot's Derby victory also stand out, as does Beauty Flash's HK Mile win. His HK career tally stands at 898 wins and he is vying for trainers' title with 44 wins this term (as of 15 April).


de Kock, Mike
Igugu, Treasure Beach

Aged 49, de Kock won his first G1 just four months into his training career in 1989. He has won every major in South Africa at least once and trained the South African Triple Crown winner, Horse Chestnut. He has enjoyed considerable success at the Dubai World Cup Carnival winning the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic, the UAE Derby five times, both the Dubai Duty Free and the Godolphin Mile twice with Soft Falling Rain winning the latter this year, and in 2013 he also added the G1 Al Quoz Sprint to the list thanks to Shea Shea. He is also a force when he heads to Hong Kong, winning the APQEII Cup with Irridescence (2006) and Archipenko (2008) and the 2008 Hong Kong Cup with Eagle Mountain. As well as his strong overseas base in Dubai, he now has another satellite yard in England.


Fownes, Caspar
Thumbs Up

Aged 45, Caspar Fownes assisted his trainer father Lawrie for several seasons before taking over the mantle in 2003/04. He eclipsed his father's best season stats in his rookie year with 44 winners and in 2006/07 won his first trainers' premiership. His most famous victory that season was with The Duke in the G1 HK Mile. He has a good strike-rate at Happy Valley where on 20 June 2010 he sent out six winners in a day, equalling the record in Hong Kong's professional racing era. He won his second premiership in 2008/09 and was second in the table in 2009/10, the season in which Super Satin gave him a first Hong Kong Derby and Green Birdie won the G1 KrisFlyer International Sprint in Singapore. His stable star in recent times has been Lucky Nine, winner of the G1 HK Sprint and HKG1 HK Classic Mile in 2011, the HKG1 Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup in 2012 and this season's G2 Jockey Club Sprint and HKG1 Chairman's Sprint Prize. He has a current Hong Kong career total of 520 wins with 44 this term (as of 15 April).


Fujiwara, Hideaki
Eishin Flash

Aged 47, Hideaki Fujiwara obtained his JRA trainer license in 2000, and has saddled no fewer than 396 JRA winners (as of 8 April), including 29 graded race successes, so far in his career. His stable's top performers included 2008 Victoria Mile winner Asian Winds, 2009 February Stakes winner Success Brocken, as well as 2010 Japanese Derby and last year's Tenno Sho (Autumn) winner Eishin Flash.


Gibson, Richard
Akeed Mofeed

Aged 43, formerly French-based Englishman Richard Gibson had a strong grounding in the trainer's art with Frenchmen Pascal Bary and Henri-Alex Pantall as well as Americans Bill Mott and Gary Jones. He took out his first licence at Chantilly in 1996 and struck gold as early as 1999 when Lady of Chad won the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac en route to becoming European Champion Juvenile Filly. He has trained the winners of six G1s and two HKG1s altogether, most notably Doctor Dino, winner of successive runnings of the G1 HK Vase as well as of the G1 Man O'War Stakes at Belmont, USA. This season he saddled Akeed Mofeed to win the HKG1 BMW Hong Kong Derby and Gold-Fun to win the HKG1 Hong Kong Classic Mile. His other high-class trainees have been Marotta, Lune D'Or, Cut Quartz, Mores Wells, Swedish Shave, and for a short spell Dunaden. Gibson, who relocated to Hong Kong ahead of the 2011/12 season, has saddled 24 winners this term for a Hong Kong total of 61 (as of 15 April).



Millard, Anthony

Ambitious Dragon

Aged 51, Tony Millard was a multiple champion trainer in South Africa where he won every major race. He sent out 39 Group 1 winners in his first nine years of training before relocating to Hong Kong, including three South African Horses of the Year in Empress Club, Jet Master and Surfing Home as well as numerous other champions. He won the 2000 Hong Kong Derby in his first season with Keen Winner. His most spectacular success has come in the past three seasons with Ambitious Dragon, crowned Horse of the Year in 2010/11 and 2011/12. The champion won the Hong Kong Derby and AP QEII Cup in that first season and last term put in blistering displays to land the HKG1 Stewards' Cup and HKG1 Hong Kong Gold Cup. The six-year-old annexed the G1 Hong Kong Mile in December and the HKG1 Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup in March. Millard took Hong Kong's star mare Sweet Sanette to Royal Ascot where she finished third in the 2011 G1 King's Stand Stakes. He currently has 21 wins on the board this season for an overall total of 398 HK wins (as of 15 April).



Moore, John

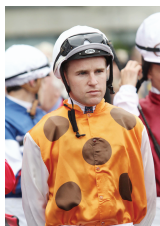
Ashkiyr, Irian, Military Attack

Aged 63, Moore has been involved in HK racing since the professional era began in 1971. He began training in 1985, before which he held the position of assistant trainer to his late famous father, George. In 2007 he prepared an international G1 double thanks to Viva Pataca in the Audemars Piguet QEII Cup and Able One in the Champions Mile, and in a feat perhaps unprecedented in the sport won the same two races with the same two horses three years later. Moore has been leader in prize-money won for the past seven seasons, thanks in part to the now retired Viva Pataca, the leading prize money winner in Hong Kong racing history. He is also the first trainer ever to send out 1,000 winners in Hong Kong. In 2010/2011 he regained the Trainers' Championship he last held in 1994/95 by winning four of the last six races of the season, finally getting the better of an epic battle with Tony Cruz. Able One gave him a third HKIR win - to go with Motivation's 1993 HK Cup win and Inspiration's success in the 2008 HK Sprint - when taking the 2011 G1 HK Mile and this season Military Attack scored in the HKG1 HK Gold Cup. He has 40 wins this season for an overall total of 1307 HK wins (as of 15 April).



England, Tye

Aged 23, Tye England's career as a jockey began in 2005, following a successful junior career in rodeo. In just his second season he was Champion Apprentice Jockey in Sydney and New South Wales with 127 winners, a total which put him in third place overall behind Darren Beadman and Zac Purton. Licensed as a senior jockey during the 2008/2009 season he has recorded G1 victories in Australia on Black Piranha in the 2009 Stradbroke Handicap and on Alverta in the 2010 Coolmore Classic. He also rode Alverta into 3rd place in the July Cup (G1) at Newmarket, England. He arrived in Hong Kong for the 2010/11 season but an injury sustained in a fall limited him to 18 wins for that debut campaign. England followed up last term with 37 successes and with 23 this season he has a Hong Kong total of 78 (as of 15 April).



Berry, Tommy

Aged 22, Berry achieved the highlight of his career so far when winning the G1 Golden Slipper atop Overreach on 6 April, his fourth top-flight win. His first came on Epaulette in the 2012 Golden Rose Stakes and he followed up with a G1 double at Randwick on 6 October, 2012 atop Fat Al (Epsom Handicap) and Glencadam Gold (Metropolitan Handicap). He began his career in 2007 and was New South Wales champion apprentice in the 2009/10 season. In April 2011, he became stable jockey to Gai Waterhouse in Sydney alongside Nash Rawiller. He opted to take up a contract with The Hong Kong Jockey Club from 28 April until season's end, despite leading the field in his pursuit of a first Sydney Jockeys' Championship. His twin brother Nathan is also a jockey.



Chadwick, Matthew

Aged 22 and a product of the HKJC Apprentice Jockeys' School, Matthew Chadwick enjoyed notable overseas success last summer, winning the Shergar Cup Silver Saddle as leading rider and helping the Rest of the World team to victory in Ascot's famous challenge. Champion apprentice in Hong Kong in 2008/09, he has already ridden 219 winners in Hong Kong, including 41 this term (as of 15 April) to sit third in the premiership. He clinched his first Group win on Egyptian Ra in the HKG3 National Day Cup in October 2009. He has struck up a notable partnership with California Memory – riding the grey to victory in the HKG1 Hong Kong Gold Cup in February 2011 and winning the past two renewals of the G1 Hong Kong Cup on Tony Cruz's charge. He is the first home grown talent to win a G1 Hong Kong International Race.



Clark, Tim

Aged 26, the former Sydney champion apprentice won his first career G1 with Typhoon Zed in The Galaxy at Royal Randwick in 2008. He also had successful partnerships with top runners such as Hot Danish, Sacred Choice and Atomic Force. Clark made a positive impact in his first Hong Kong season in 2011/12, as he notched 28 wins including an early Group race double aboard Jacobee in the HKG3 Sa Sa Ladies' Purse and Destined For Glory in the G2 Jockey Club Mile. He made a fine start to the current season with his first HK three-timer at Sha Tin on 4th November and with 31 wins (as of 15 April), for a Hong Kong total of 59 wins.



Demuro, Mirco

Aged 34 and one of Italy's top riders, he has at least 20 career G1 wins to his name including the Dubai World Cup (2011, Victoire Pisa), Japan Cup (2008, Screen Hero) and the Italian Derby (2002, Rakti). He enjoyed G1 success in his home nation Italy last September with Amaron in the G1 Premio Vittorio Di Capua and has since added a pair of G1s riding in Japan, where he has enjoyed considerable big-race success down the years, with Eishin Flash in the Tenno Sho (Autumn) in October and two-year-old Logotype in the Asahi Hai Futurity Stakes in December. He and his younger brother Cristian secured a one-two finish in the G1 Japanese 1,000 Guineas at Hanshin on 7 April, with Mirco atop Red Oval a neck second to his brother's mount Ayusan. Demuro went one better with victory on Logotype in the G1 Japanese 2,000 Guineas on 14 April.



de Sousa, Silvestre

Aged 32, de Sousa was a leading apprentice in Brazil and rode 82 winners before moving to Ireland to work for trainer Dermot Weld at age 22. After two years without a ride, he relocated to David Nicholls' stable in England, rode his first UK winner in January, 2006, and from there he worked hard to forge a reputation, riding for lesser trainers and accruing a first century in 2010. His breakthrough year was 2011 when he teamed up with trainer Mark Johnston for successes that included two wins at Royal Ascot, and the G3 German St Leger on Fox Hunt. He was appointed as a retained jockey to Godolphin in February 2012 and rode a first G1 win on Hunter's Light. He enjoyed further success in Dubai this year, winning G1 Al Maktoum Challenge Round 3 on Hunter's Light and the G1 Dubai Duty Free in Sajjhaa.



Doleuze, Olivier

Aged 41 and a former champion apprentice in France, Olivier Doleuze rode mostly for Criquette Head-Maarek in his homeland where he accrued Classic wins on Green Tune and Egyptband. He enjoyed his best Hong Kong season in 2006/07 when he rode 67 winners, the highlight being his victory on The Duke in the Hong Kong Mile. He followed up in two of the next three renewals of the Mile, scoring atop HK legend Good Ba Ba in 2007 and 2009. Doleuze has struck up a fine partnership with Eagle Regiment, winning the HKG1 Centenary Sprint Cup in 2012 and 2013. Last year he won the HKG1 HK Classic Cup on Zaidan and the G1 SIA Cup aboard Chinchon. He has ridden a total of 447 (as of 15 April) winners in HK.



Fourie, Richard

Aged 27, South African jockey Richard Fourie arrived in Hong Kong in August 2012 as the reigning Eastern Cape champion for the 2011/12 season with 47 wins – he was 5th in South Africa's national championship with 124 wins. He commenced his riding career in 2002 after passing through the South African Jockey Academy where he was inspired by a seminar delivered by Douglas Whyte. Champion Apprentice in South Africa in 2003/2004, he won the Western Cape jockeys' championship in 2007/2008 and has recorded over 650 career wins. His eight G1 wins include the 2007 & 2008 Cape Fillies Guineas on Captain's Lover and Sparkling Gem respectively, and the 2008 Investec Cape Derby and 2008 Daily News 2000 on Russian Sage. Fourie has notched 23 wins in Hong Kong so far (as of 15 April) including the HKG2 Premier Bowl on Cerise Cherry.



Marwing, Weichong

Aged 43, Weichong Marwing rode one of the all-time greats of the turf in South Africa, the Triple Crown winner Horse Chestnut, in between amassing winners through nine seasons in Hong Kong. Some of his biggest HK wins were for Ivan Allan in the 2001 Chairman's Sprint Prize on Fairy King Prawn, and a G1 treble in 2002 in the HK Classic Mile, HK Derby and HK Mile on Olympic Express. Perhaps his most memorable victory came in the 2010 G1 APQEII Cup on Viva Pataca, a race in which that champion became the leading prize money winner in Hong Kong racing history. He has also enjoyed major success on the likes of Grand Emporium, Asiatic Boy, Greys Inn and APQEII Cup winner Iridesence for trainer Mike de Kock. Chief among his 15 wins in the 2011/12 season were Sweet Orange's HKG1 HK Classic Mile victory, and Liberator's triumph in the HKG1 Standard Chartered Champions & Chater Cup. He has a HK career total of 344 wins with 32 this season (as of 15 April) including the HKG3 January Cup on Military Attack.



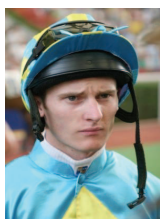
Mosse, Gerald

Aged 46, Gerald Mosse was champion apprentice in France and has gone on to win some of the world's greatest G1 races including seven at the HKIR. His career highlights are his Arc triumph on Saumarez in 1990 and his victory in the 150th Melbourne Cup on Americain in 2010. He has also won all the French Classics and all classic races in Hong Kong. He has won three Hong Kong Derbies, notched a Champions Mile victory with Bullish Luck in 2005 and three G1 successes on Beauty Flash in the HK Mile, the Stewards' Cup, and the Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup in 2010/11. He had a fine 2012 with six G1 wins in Europe, North America and Hong Kong thanks to Reckless Abandon, Wizz Kid, Siyouma and Red Cadeaux in the Hong Kong Vase. His HK career tally stands at 565 wins (as of 15 April).



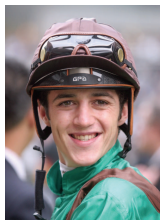
Prebble, Brett

Aged 35, Brett Prebble enjoyed a career peak in November when partnering Green Moon to win the G1 Melbourne Cup. A native of Ballarat, Victoria, he is a former champion apprentice and twice champion jockey in Melbourne. He was third in the HK jockeys' championship last term after finishing runner-up for the previous six years. He rode his 600th HK win on Fiery Raider on 14 November and jointly holds the Hong Kong record of riding six winners in one meeting, at Happy Valley on 20 June 2010. He has enjoyed notable partnerships with top HK runners such as Lucky Nine, Cape Of Good Hope, Bullish Luck and Sacred Kingdom. Prebble has thrice won the Hong Kong Sprint with Absolute Champion (2006), Sacred Kingdom (2009) and Lucky Nine (2011). His big domestic wins this season have come on Packing Whiz in the HKG2 Chairman's Trophy and Lucky Nine in the HKG1 Chairman's Sprint Prize and G2 Jockey Club Sprint. He has 623 Hong Kong career wins (as of 15 April).



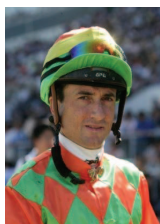
Purton, Zac

Aged 30, Zac Purton is in his sixth full term in HK. After finishing runner-up in the HK jockeys' title race last season with 64 wins, this campaign has seen him emerge as a viable contender to Douglas Whyte's domination. Raised in northern New South Wales, Purton won the Brisbane jockeys' premiership as an apprentice in 2003, and seeking a fresh challenge, later moved to Sydney where he came second only to perennial champion, Darren Beadman. His first G1 win came on Excites in the 2006 Produce Stakes at Randwick and his initial major HK win was in the HKG1 Stewards' Cup on Fellowship in 2010. Last year the jockey reached new heights aboard Little Bridge, winning the G1 King's Stand Stakes at Royal Ascot and this season he has been ever present on Ambitious Dragon, winning the G1 Hong Kong Mile and HKG1 Queens' Silver Jubilee Cup. His total HK win tally stands at 302 as he sits second in the premiership with 65 wins (as of 15 April).



Soumillon, Christophe

Aged 31 and with over 70 G1 wins under his belt, Christophe Soumillon is one of the world's finest jockeys. France's Champion Apprentice in 1999, his precocious talent brought early associations with two of the biggest names in French racing – Andre Fabre and the Aga Khan. He partnered the latter's unbeaten Zarkava to five G1 wins, culminating in the 2008 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. Now a freelance, he has thrice been France's champion jockey (2003, 2005 and 2006). As well as winning just about every major race in France, the Belgian has captured major wins in Britain, Italy, USA, Canada, Japan, UAE and Turkey. His several Hong Kong G1 triumphs include Viva Pataca's 2006 HK Derby and Good Ba Ba's 2008 HK Mile. He has already notched a G1 this year thanks to Shea Shea in the Al Quoz Sprint.



Whyte, Douglas

Aged 41 and with 12 uninterrupted Hong Kong Champion Jockey titles to his name, Douglas Whyte is a unique competitor. The outstanding South African is the only jockey to have ridden over 1000 Hong Kong winners and in 2011 he passed the HK\$1 billion mark in prize money won. On 7 April, 2013 he equalled the Hong Kong record of most wins in a day with a six-timer at Sha Tin. Known as the "Durban Demon", he partnered South African star London News to major wins including the J&B Met and QEII Cup. Other notable Hong Kong victories include the Hong Kong Vase on Indigenous and the Hong Kong Derby atop Super Satin, Fay Fay and Akeed Mofeed, as well as Ambitious Dragon's APQEII Cup win in 2011. He has 72 wins to lead the jockeys' title race for a total HK win tally stands of 1495 (as of 15 April).

Pari-Mutuel Pools

- Jockeys participating in the nominated races in a race meeting will be numbered as 1 to 14. Nos. 1 to 13 (Named Jockey) will be assigned to one jockey each, while No. 14 (Others) will include the rest of the jockeys for the race meeting.
- Jockeys riding the first three placed horses on their Scheduled Rides will earn Jockey Challenge Points – 12, 6 and 4 points respectively. Scheduled Rides means the rides that a jockey is engaged to ride in the nominated races at a race meeting at the start selling of Jockey Challenge.
- Jockey Challenge Points scored by Substitute Jockeys will not count.
